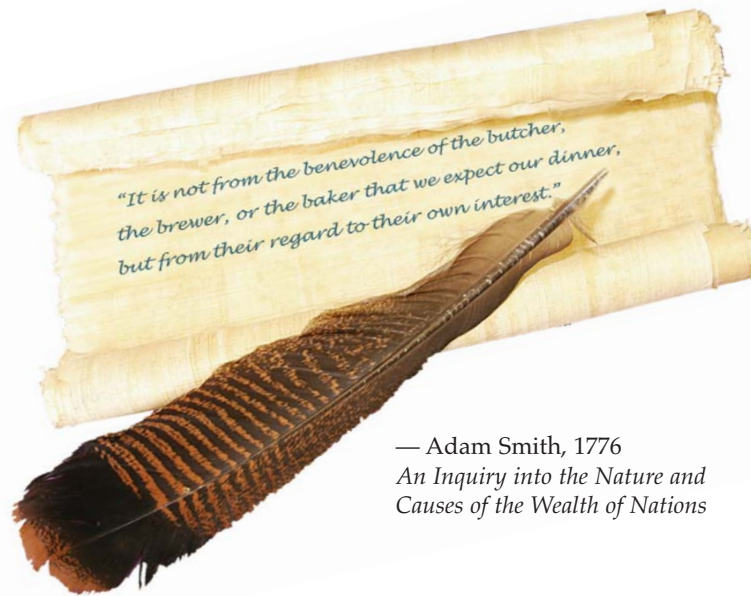

Adam Smith was a Scotsman.

A contemporary of Voltaire, Rousseau and Benjamin Franklin. A philosopher and thinker. But it is his book, *The Wealth of Nations*, for which Adam Smith is best known.

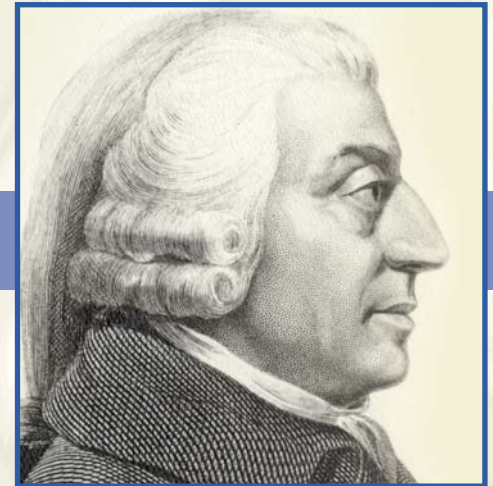
